Joint Base Lewis McChord offers golfers a chance to tee it up at both Eagle's Pride and Whispering Firs

From a USGA article by Hunki Yun, "Golf and the military instill and promote shared values and characteristics: integrity, honor, respect, discipline, fortitude." While choosing courses to play in Western Washington, don't miss your chance to continue nurturing these values by playing a few rounds at Joint Base Lewis-McChord's two courses: Eagle's Pride Golf Course and Whispering Firs Golf Course.

It's no surprise there is ample room for two courses at JBLM since it's such a geographically large installation, but did you know Eagle's Pride Golf Course is outside the base's gates? Accessing the course located right off I-5 exit 116 could not be easier! Eagle's Pride offers 27 holes of quintessential Pacific Northwest golf that is challenging yet enjoyable for golfers of all skill levels.

Throughout the property you will find towering evergreens, rolling fairways and undulating greens that require thoughtful shot-making and course management to score well. The Red and Blue courses are the typical 18-hole layout, with the Green course serving as the alternate nine. All three courses offer unique challenges, and there is always debate on which of the three is one's favorite or the most challenging!

On top of the three courses, you can also play inside the lounge at Eagle's Pride. That's right! Military members and the public can enjoy indoor golfing with the Golf Simulator option. Reservations are available for groups of up to eight players, so while you can utilize the simulator for serious practice, trying out new clubs and viewing launch monitor data, you can also just gather a group of friends to have some fun. Golf is only one of the game options the simulator offers. Turn your indoor play into a party with games such as rugby, hockey, football, zombie dodgeball and more.

Heading inside the base gates, Whispering Firs Golf Course boasts 18 holes that are open to the public.

You can book on GolfNow or by calling the pro shop. Those without DoD ID cards must make a quick stop at the Visitor Center to get a day pass onto JBLM in order to play. Please add 10-20 minutes to your planned travel time to accommodate for the guest pass process. Once at the course, you will find a picturesque setting, great design and welcoming atmosphere for all golfers. Besides enjoying the course,

fers popular breakfast burritos to snag a filling bite before your morning tee time or lunch and snack items for after you finish your round. Both courses at JBLM have driving ranges, practice greens and well-stocked pro shops.

The courses offers tournaments such as CG scrambles and the popular longstanding Fort Lewis Amateur that will have its 67th annual tournament on May 2 and 3. It is a 36

hole stroke play event. It also has a senior division. You can register by visiting the Eagle's Pride website or calling the pro shop.

Golf courses abound in SW Washington

If you are making a trip north or south on Interstate-5 you will find a mix of courses

Southwest Washington is an area that stretches from the state capitol in Olympia to just east of Vancouver to include the Washington Coast. Golf options range from 9 and 18-hole public golf courses, to some of the best country clubs you will find in entire Pacific Northwest.

Take a look at what this area has to offer:

Golf Club at Hawk's Prairie

The Golf Club at Hawks Prairie, located in Lacey, Washington, just north of Olympia, is a premier 36-hole facility featuring two distinct public courses: The Woodlands and The Links.

The facility is renowned for offering a diverse golfing experience, with one course carved through dense old-growth forest and the other designed as a Scottish-style layout with views of the Puget Sound and Mt. Rainier.

The Woodlands presents tree-lined fairways and the Links, while more open, has its share of tree-lined fairways too.

As part of the Oki Golf umbrella, there are many ways to save and play the Hawks Prairie courses. A variety of membership plans and options can be found on their website: www.okigolf.com.

Indian Summer Golf & CC

Indian Summer Golf and Country Club is perhaps the best-known club in Olympia for hosting the PGA Tour's developmental tour, now called Korn Ferry Tour. It is one of the four country clubs in

Southwest Washington. The Peter L. H. Thompson designed golf course is built to rigid, tournament-caliber specifications with magnificent, old-growth forest and an abundance of water features.

The course continually makes the list of the top golf courses. They opened to allow public play a few years ago so don't pass up a chance to play a superb course. This course is truly a must play for every golfer.

Newaukum Valley Golf Club

Newaukum Valley Golf Club is a premier 27-hole public golf facility located in Chehalis, Washington, featuring three distinct nine-hole courses—the South, East, and West nines—designed to accommodate golfers of all skill levels.


Riverside Golf Course

Riverside Golf Course in Chehalis has long been a popular stop for travelers on Interstate-5. The course is situated along the banks of the Chehalis River. The "Riverside Bistro & Rooftop Bar" is a popular place for golfers after their round. The RV park offers travelers Play & Stay package and full hook-ups on concrete pads.

Lewis River Golf Course

Lewis River Golf Course has endured a lot in its 50+ years of existence. And now it is under new ownership.

Located on nearly a mile of Lewis River front-

age, Lewis River Golf Course features tree-lined fairways and some of the finest greens in the Northwest. Accuracy is required in order to score well here. With green affordable green fees, it offers an excellent blend of challenge and value.

Built in 1967 by Ralph Stading, who had a reputation for providing a high quality experience to golfers. It was managed by the Stading family until they sold it to Matthew Dumke, a Portland businessman in 2021. The new owner dedicated a significant amount of money to improving the course, the infrastructure and clubhouse.

The course is a favorite of golfers in the greater Vancouver/Portland area. The clubhouse is a rustic architecture that was built in 2001 and is known for its storybook setting for weddings overlooking the river.

Eagle's Pride-Whispering Firs

Eagle's Pride and Whispering Firs are the two primary golf facilities located at Joint Base Lewis-McChord (JBLM).

Eagle's Pride is a 27-hole facility located in DuPont, known for its expansive layout surrounded by woodland and modern amenities like a \$100,000 golf simulator, while Whispering Firs Golf Course is located on McChord Field characterized by tight, tree-lined fairways and small, challenging greens.

Complementing Eagle's Pride, golfers have a year-round practice facility that features 10 covered hitting areas with light and heat. The range has grass landing area which offers real ball performance feedback. It is open to the public and was voted among the top 10 military courses in the U.S.

Whispering Firs is 18 holes and 6,646 yards from the back tee with a rating of 71.8 and slope of 122. The layout is "tighter" than Eagle's Pride, rewarding shot placement and accuracy over raw power due to its tree-lined fairways and several water hazards.

Their signature hole is #15 that is a par 5 and a whopping 545 yards long. This hole is followed closely by Hole 6, another par 5, which measures

535 yards. Play is allowed for active and retired military and their family. Guests are also allowed, but must go through the guard gate to enter.

Salish Cliffs Golf Club

Salish Cliffs opened for play in 2011 as part of the Squaxin Island Indian Tribe's Little Creek Casino and was an award winner instantly. The Gene Bates-designed layout features rolling terrain, plenty of water and sand, and they were named one of the top new courses to open in 2011 by Golfweek, being ranked eighth. The course also is ranked fourth in the state of Washington by Golfweek on the Best You Can Play list.

A practice range with multiple targets only adds to the fun before or after a round.

Salish Cliffs offers an upscale full hookup RV parking area next to the casino. There are 44 spaces with full hookups.

The casino is an easy walk from the RV park where gaming, food and drinks are a nice perk for overnighters.

Tri-Mountain Golf Course

The course that gets the most exposure from being near Interstate-5 is Tri-Mountain in Ridgefield, just north of Vancouver. You can see virtually the entire course as well as Mt. St. Helens, Mt. Adams and Mt. Hood – hence the name, Tri-Mountain. The course turned 30 years old in 2024.

The course is undergoing an ownership change as the Cowlitz Indian Tribe is buying Tri-Mountain from Clark County.

Don't forget to hit balls into the watery driving range where you actually don't get penalized for hitting balls into a lake.

The course is a links-style layout where you can see everything that is in front of you. The Bill Robinson-designed course offers plenty of sand and water to keep you focused. The course prides itself in being in pristine condition year round. The banquet room can handle up to 200 people for tournaments and special occasions.

Tahoma Valley Golf Course

Tahoma Valley Golf Club (formerly Nisqually Golf Club), located in the scenic town of Yelm, Washington, is an 18-hole public golf facility known for its year-round playability and stunning views of Mount Rainier from every hole. The rural setting allows golfers to enjoy their round peacefully.

The course is renowned for its sandy soil composition and superior drainage, which allows it to remain one of the driest and most playable courses in the Puget Sound region even during the wet winter months.

The Home Course

The Home Course has made headlines, not only for being one of the top courses in the Pacific Northwest but for also playing host to the qualifying rounds at the United States Amateur in 2010.

The Home Course layout is a walkable design with panoramic views of Puget Sound, the Olympic Mountains, and Mount Rainier. The course meanders through varied terrain, and has five sets of tees ranging from 5,470 yards to a challenging 7,424 yards from the back tees.

The Home Course is a treat with superb conditions, and all the challenges you could hope for in a round of golf. If you are a long ball hitter and want to really test your game.

Skamania Lodge

In 2021, the Skamania Lodge resort replaced its traditional 18-hole championship course with The Gorge 9, a 9-hole short course, and The Little Eagle 18, an 18-hole putting course, both designed to provide a high-quality experience in a fraction of the time. It features holes ranging from 70 to over 200 yards, utilizing multiple tee locations to challenge various skill levels.

A notable feature of the facility is the use of synthetic turf for both tee boxes and greens, which ensures consistent playing conditions year-round.

Tumwater Valley Golf Course

One of most distinctive features at Tumwater Valley Golf Course is the choice of play on holes #8 and #11; for example, at hole #8, golfers can select between a short par-3 (131 yards from the white tees) or a long par-3 (183 yards). This flexibility contributes to its reputation as one of the most unique courses in the Pacific Northwest. Historically, the course gained fame when Arnold Palmer played there in 1973, recording a score of 71.

The second and 17th holes are unusual in that they both have two greens. One green plays much shorter than the other, giving both the low and high handicap players different choices from the tee box.

The course stretches to nearly 7,200 yards from the tips, and when the wind blows, it plays a whole lot longer. They also have a 10-acre driving range ideal for perfecting your swing

Camas Meadows Golf Club

Located just minutes from Portland, Oregon's PDX airport, Camas Meadows is placed adjacent to Lacamas Lake in Camas, Washington.

The 18-hole course was established in 2000, and was designed by Andy Raugust (formerly with Jack Nicklaus Golf Services). It is a par-72 course with yardage ranging from 4,859 to 6,518.

The fairways are surrounded by towering evergreens and lush natural wetlands and is open to the general public.

Through the Washington Youth Golf Academy at Camas Meadows, the course reaches over 14,000 youths across three school districts at no cost to the schools. In addition, the course has been recognized by the PNW PGA for its adult development programs.

2 PERSON TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

Battle at the Resorts is scheduled to take place from May 1st to May 3rd, 2026, featuring a two-person team format across three premier courses: Glaze Meadow at Black Butte Ranch, and the Ridge and Resort courses at Eagle Crest Resort.

This event, formerly known as the Central Oregon Shootout, utilizes a round-robin style where different flights rotate through the participating courses over three days.

Black Butte Ranch

Participants compete in six net divisions with a maximum handicap of 36 for men and 42 for ladies, and a maximum 6-stroke differential between partners.

The tournament structure involves three distinct formats of play: a Two-Person Scramble on Friday, May 1; a Two-Person Best Ball on Saturday, May 2; and a Two-Person Chapman on Sunday, May 3.

Eagle Crest Resort

Practice rounds are available on April 30, 2026, for \$59 (walking) or \$82 (riding), followed by the "Cinco De Mayo Bash" at Eagle Crest's newly remodeled Resort Course Deck.

Ocean Shores a tourist favorite; Capitol City plays dry year-round

Lake Cushman Golf Course

Lake Cushman Golf Course sits on the edge of the Olympic National Park, high above the Hood Canal community of Hoodsport. In a park-like setting, this well maintained 9-hole course is a must play when traveling along Highway 101. Walk or ride, your choice, complete with driving range, practice green and pro-shop.

A popular choice for local tournaments and an easy drive from Shelton, Belfair & Olympia. It's a great place to get away from the city and traffic congestion.

Ocean Shores Golf Course

Ocean Shores for years has been a must-stop for tourists traveling to the coast. Some of the best lodging and accommodations on Washington's Coast can be found in this resort town.

The course has exceptional drainage, which allow for firm playing conditions even during the rainy Pacific Northwest winters. The course is user friendly and remains one of the strong attractions for the peninsula town. The front and back nine are quite different: One is a links-style layout, the other plays through trees.

There is unique shopping and recreational attractions – like go-karts, mopeds, horseback riding and the opportunity to drive your car on the beach.

Highland Golf Course

Highland Golf Course is a straightforward design where holes run parallel to one another, separated by mature trees that help contain errant shots. Notably, the course is considered beginner-friendly and forgiving, as it contains only two bunkers across the entire 18 holes and features no permanent water hazards. It is the oldest golf course in Grays Harbor County and started out as a nine-hole golf course in 1931 became 18 holes with the addition of the new front nine, built in the early 1990s.

The 18-hole course features 6,112 yards of golf from the longest tees for a par of 70 with some

tall trees and other challenges throughout the 18 holes of play.

Three Rivers, Mint Valley

Three Rivers Golf Course and Mint Valley Golf Course are two of the most prominent public golfing destinations in the Cowlitz County. Both are 18 holes and good public tracks. Three Rivers was built on a base of material deposited by the 1980 eruption of Mt. St. Helens. This porous combination of ash, dust, sand and silt drains well in wet weather.

Mint Valley has a covered range and a 6-hole par 3 pitch and putt course for anyone from beginners to families to try.

Capitol City Golf Club

In western Washington's traditionally wet climate, golf courses are often remembered for being wet or dry. Built on a past gravel pit in 1962, Capitol City Golf Club has excellent drainage and has enjoyed the reputation of being one of the driest courses in western Washington. But it's more than just a dry course, it has tree-lined fairways and is well bunkered with well-maintained greens. It plays to 6,578 yards from the back tees.

Elk Ridge Golf Course

You won't find a more beautiful and rewarding golf experience in the Southwest Washington area. Elk Ridge Golf Course at Carson Hot Springs boasts scenic views from almost every hole along with large, undulating greens and narrow fairways with tall grasses in true links fashion. A challenging course that demands accuracy, it features a first class practice facility. Only a 45-minute drive from the Portland/Vancouver Metro area.

Lake Limerick Golf Club

Lake Limerick is a semi-private course open to public play just outside of Shelton and features a challenging course surrounded by 1,100 homes and recreational lots. The course is tight with tall

trees lining most fairways and lots of elevation changes that makes you think your way around the course. The two-tee system from the front nine to the back nine give a completely different challenge to most holes, especially on the dogleg holes where tee shot placement can be critical to avoid trees that block approach to greens. It plays to 5,771 yards, but don't be fooled by its short yardage, Lake Limerick makes up for the shorter distance with tight tree-lined fairways and its smallish size greens that will challenge your approach shots and short game.

The golf course was recently listed as #19 of the Top Public Short Courses in the U.S. by *Golf Pass*.

Scott Lake Golf & County Club

Scott Lake is a 9-hole regulation course located at the Scott Lake Golf & Country Club facility in Olympia. From the longest tees it presents 2,550 yards of golf for a par of 35. It is open for the public to play and is described as a fairly easy course.

Country Clubs to check out

• **Olympia Country and Golf Club** is located along Budd Inlet with sweeping views of south Puget Sound and plays just over 6,000 yards but features a tight and hilly layout. Plenty of interesting shots and some terrific views are to be found at Olympia.

• **Grays Harbor Country Club** is a nine-hole layout and is one of the oldest clubs in the Northwest having opened in 1912. The terrain is characterized by fairways lined with tall fir and cedar trees and small, fast greens that demand accuracy and a strong short game.

• **Longview Country Club** is a historic private golf facility established in 1927. The course is an 18-hole experience with a par of 70, a total length of 6,215 yards, a course rating of 71.0, and a slope rating of 129. It is a parkland-style course known for its scenic views of the Columbia River valley.
